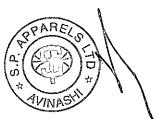

Mr. P.Yesuthasen has been an independent Director on the Board of Tamilnad Mercantile Bank Ltd since 26th November, 2009.

The Company has received a declaration from him confirming that he meets the criteria of independence as provided under Section 149(6) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") and is not disqualified from being appointed as Independent Director in terms of Section 164 of the Act.

Section 149(10) of the Act provides that an Independent Director shall hold office for a term up to 5 (five) years on the Board of Directors of companies on which he is appointed and is not liable to retire by rotation pursuant to Section 149(13) read with Section 152 of the Act.

The Company has received a notice in writing from a member along with the deposit of requisite amount under Section 160 of the Act proposing the candidature of Mr. P.Yesuthasen for the office of Director of the Company.

The Board of Directors of your Company recommends the appointment of Mr. P.Yesuthasen as an Independent Director of the Company for a period of 5 (five) years, with effect from 30th September, 2015.

None of the Directors or Key Managerial Personnel of the Company and their relatives, other than Mr. P.Yesuthasen (being the appointee) is concerned or interested, financially or otherwise, in the resolution set out in Item No.6.

Accordingly the Board recommends passing of the special resolution as set out in item no. 6 of the Notice.

As per clause V of the Memorandum of Association (MOA) of the Company, the Authorised Share Capital at present is Rs.47,25,00,000/- (Rupees forty seven crores and twenty five lakhs) divided into 2,00,00,000 (Two crores) Equity Shares of Rs.10/- (Rupees ten) each, 2,00,00,000 (Two crores) Preference Shares of Rs.10/- (Rupees ten) each and 72,50,000 (Seventy two lakhs fifty thousand) 6% Fully Convertible Preference Shares of Rs.10/- each.

The Board at its meeting held on 26th June, 2015 passed resolution for conversion of 72,49,454 nos. of the said 6% Fully Convertible Preference Shares of Rs.10/- each and allotted and issued 3,45,212 equity shares of Rs.10/- each (including a premium of Rs.200/- each per share) in favour of M/s. Euro Asia Agencies Limited, Hong Kong.

In view of this conversion, the aforesaid clause V of the MOA needs to be amended by reclassification, comprising of Rs.47,25,00,000/- (Rupees forty seven crores and twenty five lakhs) divided into 2,72,50,000 (Two crores seventy two lakhs and fifty thousand) Equity Shares of Rs.10/-(Rupees ten) each and 2,00,00,000 (Two crores) Preference Shares of Rs.10/- (Rupees ten) each.

In terms of section 13 of the Companies Act, 2013, the Memorandum of Association of the Company is to be amended as required above with the approval of the shareholders of the Company.

The existing Articles of Association (AOA) are based on the Companies Act, 1956 and several regulations in the existing AOA contain references to specific sections of the Companies Act, 1956 and some regulations in the existing AOA are no longer in conformity with the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act).

Several regulations of the existing AOA of the Company require alteration or deletions. Given this position, it is considered expedient to replace wholly the existing AOA by a new set of Articles.

The new AOA proposed to be substituted in place of the existing AOA is based on Table 'F' of Schedule I of the Act which sets out the model articles of association for a company limited by shares. This proposed new AOA to be adopted is aligned with the provisions of the Act.

A copy of the proposed set of new AOA of the Company would be available for inspection for the members at the Registered Office of the Company during the office hours on any working day, except Sundays and public holidays, between 11.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. till the date of AGM.

Pursuant to Section 14 of the Act, the consent of the members by way of Special Resolution is required for alteration of the present AOA of the Company.

The Board recommends the Special Resolution set forth in Item No. 8 of the Notice for approval of the members.

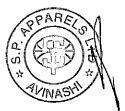

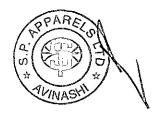

REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE

Your Company's performance reflects strong improvements in establishing its export market and reliable customers who have reposed trust and confidence on the Company and its products. Though there is no increase in number of customers, the existing customers have increased their quantum of orders which helped the Company to perform better.

The Company has reported total revenue of Rs.4,824.71 million in comparison to Rs.4,497.86 million of the previous year at an increase of 7.27 %. The EBITDA is Rs.763.89 million as against Rs.656.38 million of the previous year reporting an increase of 16.38 %. The operational cash profit is Rs.452.36 million in comparison to Rs.300.76 million of the previous year.

The net profit after tax is Rs.104.48 million as against Rs.74.24 million of the previous year registering an increase of 40.73%. Thus your Company's balance sheet as at 31st March, 2015 reflect a healthy position with a net worth of Rs.1,332.43 million.

SUBSIDIARY COMPANIES AND CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The consolidated financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries has been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

A statement pursuant to first proviso to Section 129(3) of the Companies Act, 2013, in Form No. AOC-1 in respect of subsidiary companies is attached vide Annexure -1.

DIVIDEND

The Board has recommended dividend of 6% for the 72,49,454 nos. of 6% Compulsorily Convertible Preference Shares of Rs.10/- each.

REVIEW OF OPERATIONS

The increase in export sales is contributed mainly by the existing customers who are having longstanding relationship with the Company. The Company has its budget for export sales for the current year at Rs.4,720 million. Excepting addition of few new customers, there would be no change in the existing customers as the Company is confidently achieving its budgeted target with the existing customers.

The Company's Spinning division is performing exceptionally well and during this year it is able to supply yarn for captive consumption.

The Processing division is operating at 85% of its installed capacity and meeting the Company's requirements besides undertaking jobs from third parties.

The Retail division has performed better comparing last year and is expected to do better during current vear after a strategic bifurcation of activities.

BOARD MEETINGS

During the financial year 2014-15, the Board of the Company held four meetings of the Board on 25th June, 2014, 17th September, 2014, 11th December, 2014 and 5th March, 2015.



SHARE CAPITAL

The Board of the Company has converted fully the 6% Compulsorily Convertible Preference Shares of Rs.72.49 million into 3,45,212 equity shares of Rs.10/- each with the premium of Rs.200/- per share at its meeting held on 26th June, 2015.

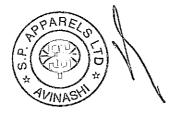
RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

MATERIAL CHANGES AND COMMITMENTS

There have been no material changes and commitments, affecting the financial position of the Company which have occurred between the end of the financial year of the Company to which the financial statements relate and the date of the report and there has been no change in the nature of business.

VIGIL MECHANISM

Your Company has established a vigil mechanism for reporting of genuine concerns through the Whistle Blower policy of the Company. Further, the Company believes in providing opportunity and key positions to women professionals and encourage them by creating proper policies to tackle issues relating to safe and proper working conditions for them and create and maintain a healthy, conducive work environment and free of discrimination including gender and any form of sexual harassment.

CONSERVATION OF ENERGY

The Processing division of the Company by having rain water harvesting has managed its full requirement of water and thus made contribution to natural resource management. Further, its condensation of steam into water collection has reduced fuel consumption.

The Company has utilized thermal energy to have continuous power supply for its Processing and Spinning divisions during lean months which reduced consumption of genset power during the period.

TECHNOLOGY ABSORPTION

The Company is updating technologies in all its manufacturing operations. In its processing division, it has installed automatic coal feeder in place of manual feeding which has improved efficiency of boilers upto 80% against 58% in the previous years. In this process, the unburnt fuel is reduced. The Company has installed compacting machine in spinning division to improve its productivity and quality of the yarn.

BUSINESS RISK MANAGEMENT

As part of good governance practices, the Board evaluates its performance from time to time at its meetings and that of its committees and individual directors.

The evaluation was broadly based on parameters such as understanding of the Company's vision, objectives, skills, knowledge, experience, participation and attendance in Board/Committee meetings.

The performance evaluation of the Chairman and Managing Director of the Company was made by the Independent Directors taking into account the views of all other Directors. MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Global Economic Scenario

The global economy continued to expand during 2014 at a moderate and uneven pace, as the prolonged recovery process from the global financial crisis was still saddled with unfinished post-crisis adjustments. Global recovery was also hampered by some new challenges, including a number of unexpected shocks, such as the heightened geopolitical conflicts in various areas of the world.

Growth of world gross product (WGP) was at 2.6 per cent in 2014, marginally better than the growth of 2.5 per cent registered in 2013, but lower than the 2.9 per cent projected. In the outlook period, premised on a set of assumptions and subject to a number of uncertainties and downside risks, the global economy is expected to strengthen in the following two years, with WGP projected to grow by 3.1 and 3.3 per cent in 2015 and 2016, respectively.

China will continue its "soft fall" growth trajectory, as already limited government stimuli will have less effect despite recent monetary easing, and expose the weakening of China's creditworthiness clearly. Other major emerging markets will continue to grow, but their pace will vary depending on the net impact of declining oil prices and exchange rate depreciations, as well as progress of their own reform agendas. (Source: UN report).

Indian Economy

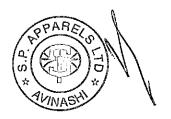
India is the ninth largest economy of the globe after the United States, China, Japan, Germany, UK, France, Brazil and Italy. The gross domestic product (GDP) at current prices stands at US \$ 2.1 trillion which accounts to 2.65% of the world economy. Critical economic factors like oil prices, foreign investments, government's intent for reforms etc. have tilted in favour of the economy with focus returning back on the growth and revival of Indian economy through improvement in policy decisions, business and consumer confidence, liberalization of FDI norms, promotion of investment in infrastructure and simplification of tax regime. India's GDP is expected to grow at an annual growth rate of more than 7.5% for the next 5 years (Source: International Monetary Fund).

Indian Textile and Apparel Industry

India is among the leading textile and apparel manufacturing and exporting countries in the world. The Indian textile and apparel industry is characterized by its strong vertical integration with presence in almost all the sub-sectors of the industry starting from fibre to retail and exports. India's capability of producing both natural and man-made fibre based textile and apparel products, its manpower availability along with a scope of entrepreneurial talent reflect the robust edifice of growth prospects of Indian textiles sector.

In 2014, the contribution of textiles and apparel was more than 5% to India's GDP. India's textiles and apparel industry is estimated to be worth US \$ 97 billion in 2014; of this, the share of domestic market was 60% and exports 40%. In 2014, India exported apparel worth US \$ 16.5 billion; the share of India in global apparel exports has increased from 2.6% in 2004 to 3.5% in 2014 (Source: Technopak Analysis)

India exported apparel worth US \$ 16.5 billion in 2014. India's total apparel exports value increased by a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 7.9% from 2009 to 2014. During this period India's exports of woven apparel grew at a faster CAGR 8.1% compared to knit apparel which grew at 7.6%. However, in the global market, demand for knit apparel has been increasing at a higher rate. Hence, knit apparel exports is a potential growth opportunity for India.



India remains as a preferable apparel sourcing destination owing to its strengths in an abundant supply of raw material, vertically integrated supply chain, expertise in value added garment manufacturing, availability of skilled manpower and well-established relationship with key global buyers.

India's apparel exports is expected to grow at a CAGR of 10% to reach US \$ 44 billion by 2024. This will increase India's share in global apparel exports from 3.6% in 2014 to 5.2% in 2024.

Government Support Schemes

Government of India provides several production and exports related incentives to promote apparel manufacturing and exports of India.

Revised Restructured Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (RR-TUFS) supports modernization and upgradation of the industry. Under this scheme, government provides 5% interest reimbursement and 10% capital subsidy on specified machinery for garmenting units and fabric processing and 5% for knitting and fabric embroidery.

Scheme for Integrated Textiles Parks (SITP) aims to provide the industry world-class infrastructure facilities for setting up their textile and apparel production units. Under this scheme, Government of India supports by the way of grant or equity limited to 40% of the project cost subject to a ceiling of Rs. 40 crores to cover cost of common infrastructure and buildings for production/support activities.

Growth Prospects

The increase in volume of business was mainly due to the Company's existing customers who have reposed trust and confidence on the Company and its products. The Company has comfortable order position for execution (including for new orders) to all its existing customers. There was no increase in the number of customers on the export front, however, the Company identified a few global players based in Europe for long period similar to our existing customers. With addition of these new customers, the Company would enlarge its customer base besides improving its growth rate.

The Company has achieved a higher 12 % of its export sales in comparison to the previous year. In order to meet out the sales target we have increased the capacity by addition of 3 new factories.

As our customers are expecting value addition to their businesses such as design support and technical support, we have incorporated a wholly owned subsidiary in UK which is headed by an expert hailing from UK with 40 years of experience in the same field. He has wide business connections with top retailers in UK. In addition to service support, this company will source directly from various countries for retailers of other products and has been receiving orders for execution.

The Company has installed new machineries in its Dyeing division with a capital expenditure of around Rs.4.50 crores thereby the bottlenecks in finishing operations have been removed which in turn enhanced the productivity with improved quality.

The Company proposes to enlarge its production base shortly with a capital expenditure of around Rs.1.50 crores to improve the quality of yarn and to make use for captive consumption.

Retail Division

Though there was a closure of 12 non-performing stores during the period, the Company has increased by opening of equal number of stores having larger area through its franchisee which compensates the volume of retail business.

Major improvements have been made in the Company's undergarment business by segregation into (i) Wholesale Division and (ii) Direct Retail Stores (DRS). The Company has opened up its DRS headquarters at Bangalore strategically to meet the fashion driven hub of retail business. We have



employed rich experienced personnel to head each of these divisions and these divisions are giving effective results.

The Company is already in the undergarment business and in order to cater to the increase in its volume, we have allocated considerable capacity to execute uninterrupted supply for our domestic business and expect more volume of sales. We also have a plan to put up an exclusive garment factory to cater to the domestic business.

There are very few brands in India for women's wear whereas a big market exists in this segment. The Company has decided to launch its own brand "NATALIA" for women's innerwear and activewear. In addition to outsourcing, the Company would use its in-house capacity to meet the products requirements of this business.

Crocodile brand sub-licence

The Company has obtained sub-license rights from M/s.Crocodile Products Private Limited (CPPL) to manufacture, distribute and market Crocodile brand products of adults menswear such as, shirts, polo shirts, T-shirts, trousers, Jeans, sweaters, jackets and adults men's innerwear such as, vest, brief, boxer shorts, socks under "Crocodile" brand for the territory of India for a period of 7 (seven) years commencing from 1st October, 2015 and subsequent period renewal will be in line with the renewal of the license agreement between M/s.Crocodile International Pte Ltd (CIPL) and CPPL. The Company has executed an agreement for the same and is in the process of achieving higher growth with this addition of brand value products.

Notes forming part of the financial statements

1. Significant Accounting Polices

1.1 Basis of Accounting and preparation of financial statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the 2013 Act") / Companies Act, 1956 ("the 1956 Act"), as applicable. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

1.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian-GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

1.3 Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are stated as cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of assets comprises of purchase price and directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to working conditions for its intended use including borrowing cost and incidental expenditure during construction incurred up to the date of commissioning.

Capital work in progress includes building under construction, construction expenditure incurred thereon and interest on the funds deployed.

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided under straight line method based on useful life prescribed in Schedule – II of the Companies Act, 2013 Depreciation on tangible fixed assets has been provided on the straight-line method as per the useful life prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 except in respect of the following categories of assets, in whose case the life of the assets has been assessed as under based on technical advice, taking into account the nature of the asset, the estimated usage of the asset, the operating conditions of the asset, past history of replacement, anticipated technological changes, manufacturers warranties and maintenance support, etc.:

1.4 Investments

Long term investments are valued at cost, less provision for diminution, other than temporary,in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and market value.

1.5 Inventories

Raw Materials, Stores, consumables and packing materials are valued at cost. Work in Progress is valued at cost and includes production overheads as estimated by Management. Finished goods are valued under absorption cost basis at lower of cost and net realisable value after providing for obsolescence and other losses wherever considered necessary. Fabric waste is valued at net realisable value.





1.6 Revenue Recognition and Other income

Revenue from sales are recognised net of returns, rebates and trade discounts, when risk and rewards of ownership of the goods are transferred to the customer, which generally coincides with dispatch of goods from factory.

Export incentives comprising mainly of duty drawback are recognised as revenue on accrual basis, wherever certainty of receipts and value thereof are known.

Revenue from job work undertaken is recognised on delivering the goods to the customer on completion of the work.

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive the income is established.

1.7 Foreign Currency Transactions

Transaction in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. Monetary foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated at the year end exchange rate. Resultant gains or losses are recognised in the statement of profit and loss account.

The accounting standard AS 11(Revised 2003) on the "Effects of Changes in foreign exchange rates" which was amended with effect from April 1, 2004 provides guidance on accounting of Forward contracts. The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India has clarified that AS 11 (Revised) is not applicable to the forward contracts which are for hedging highly probable forecasted transactions.

The Company has entered in to forward contracts which are designated as hedge of highly probable forecasted transactions. The Gain/losses of forward contracts designated as highly probable forecasted transactions are recognised in the Profit and Loss account in the period in which the forecasted transactions is expected to occur.

1.8 Employee benefits

Short term

Short term employee benefits are charges off at the undiscounted amount in the year in which the related service is rendered.

Long term

Post retirement benefits comprises of Provident Fund and Gratuity which are accounted as follows:

I. Provident Fund

This is a defined contribution plan, and contributions made to the fund are charged to statement of Profit and loss. The company as no further obligations for future provident fund benefits other than monthly contributions.

II. Gratuity - Funded

This is a defined benefit plan. The Company makes annual contribution to a gratuity fund administered by LIC. The liability is determined based on the actuarial valuation using projected unit credit method. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised in full in statement of profit and loss for the period which they occur. The retirement Benefit obligation recognised in the Balance sheet represents the present value of the defined benefit obligation as adjusted for un-recognised past service cost.

III. Leave Encashment

There is no scheme for encashment of un-availed leave on retirement. Leave encashment of employees are paid annually and provision is made on accrual basis.





1.9 Taxes on Income

Provision for tax includes provision for current income tax deferred tax and wealth tax.

Provision for deferred tax is made for all timing differences arising between taxable incomes and accounting income at currently enacted tax rates. Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences and unabsorbed losses are recognised only where there is a virtual certainty that deferred tax assets can be realised against future taxable profits.

Provision of current tax is made for the tax payable under income tax Act, 1961.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) paid in accordance to the Indian tax laws, which gives rise to future economic benefits in the form of adjustment of future income tax liability, is considered as an asset if there is convincing evidence that the company will pay normal tax during the specified period. Accordingly, MAT credit is recognised as an asset in the Balance sheet when it is probable that the future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the company and the asset can be measured reliably.

1.10 Intangible Assets

Intangible assets include software licenses, trademarks, patents and copy-rights. Software licenses are amortized over a period of five years. Trademarks, patents and copyrights would be amortized on a straight line basis over their expected useful lives.

1.11 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying asset are capitalized (net of TUF subsidy) till the month in which asset is ready for its intended use. Other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which these are incurred.

1.12 Government grants and subsidies

Grants and subsidies from the government are recognised when there is reasonable assurance that the grant/ subsidy will be received and all attaching conditions will be complied with. When the grant or subsidy relates to an expense item, it is recognised as income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which is intended to compensate. When the grant or subsidy relates to an asset, its value is deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the related asset.

1.13 Impairment

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any indication exists, the assets are recoverable amount is estimated. An Impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

1.14 Leases

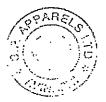
Finance Leases, which effectively transfer to the company substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased item, are capitalized at the lower of the fair value and present value of the minimum lease payments at the inception of the lease term and disclosed as leased assets.

Leases, where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risk and rewards of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognised as as expense item in the statement of profit and loss on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.15 Earnings per share

The earnings considered in ascertaining the company's EPS comprise the net profit attributable to equity shareholders after tax and includes the post tax effect of any extraordinary item. The number of shares used in computing the basic EPS is the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year. The number of shares used in computing diluted EPS comprises of weighted average shares considered for deriving basic EPS, and also the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

i) Terms & Condition of Equity shares

The Company has only one class of equity shares having a par face value of Rs.10 per share. Each holder of equity shares is entitled to one vote per share. The Company declares and pays dividend in Indian Rupees. The Dividend, if any, proposed by the Board of Directors has to be approved by the shareholders in the Annual General Meeting. In the event of liquidation of the Company, the holders of the equity shares will be antitled to receive remaining assets of the company, after settling the dues of preferential and other creditors as per priority. The distribution will be in proportion to the number of equity shares held by the shareholders.

- II) Terms & Condition of 10% Redoemable preference shares.
 1. The Company has converted a part of the unsecured loans given by the directors as Redoemable Preference shares.
 - The coupon rate is 10%;
 - The period of redemption is 10 years or as atlowed by the Directors subject to liquidity. The preference shares are of cumulative in respect of dividend payout. The redemption shall be out of accumulated profits or out of fresh issue of shares.

1.16 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of the past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent assets and liabilities are not recognised, however contingent liabilities are disclosed in the notes on accounts.

- 1.17 Cash and cash equivalents (for purposes of Cash Flow Statement)

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

1.18 Cash flow statement

*Cash flow statement has been prepared in accordance with the indirect method prescribed in Accounting Standard 3 -Cash flow Statement. Cash and Cash equivalents for cash flow statement comprises cash at bank and in hand and bank deposits with a maturity of three months or less.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF S.P. APPARELS LIMITED

Report on the Consolidated Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of S.P. APPARELS LIMITED (hereinafter referred to as "the Holding Company") and its subsidiaries (the Holding Company and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group") comprising of the Consolidated Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2015, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss, the Consolidated Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated financial statements").

Management's Responsibility for the Consolidated Financial Statements

The Holding Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of these consolidated financial statements in terms of the requirements of the Companies Act, 2013 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act")that give a true and fair view of the consolidated financial position, consolidated financial performance and consolidated cash flows of the Group in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Group and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; the selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated financial statements by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated financial statements based on our audit. While conducting the audit, we have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section I43(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the consolidated financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the consolidated financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Holding Company's preparation of the consolidated financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit

procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the Holding Company has an adequate internal financial controls system over financial reporting in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Other Matters

(a) We did not audit the financial statements / financial information of Crocodile Products Private Limited, subsidiary, whose financial statements / financial information reflect total assets of Rs.19.10 Million as at 31st March, 2015, total revenues of Rs.1.12 Million and net cash flows amounting to Rs.0.16 Million for the year ended on that date, as considered in the consolidated financial statements. These financial statements / financial information have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiary, and our report in terms of sub-sections (3) and (11) of Section 143 of the Act, insofar as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiary, is based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

(b) We did not audit the financial statements / financial information of S.P. Apparels UK (P) Ltd subsidiary, whose financial statements / financial information reflect total assets of Rs.0.93 Million as at 31st March, 2015, total revenues of Rs.0.00 Million and net cash flows amounting to Rs.0.93 Million for the year ended on that date, as considered in the consolidated financial statements. These financial statements / financial information are unaudited and have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the



amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiary, and our report in terms of subsections (3) and (11) of Section 143 of the Act in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiary, is based solely on such unaudited financial statements / financial information. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us by the Management, these financial statements / financial information are not material to the Group.

Our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, and our report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements below, is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors and the financial statements / financial information certified by the Management.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- 1. As required by the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2015 ("the Order"), issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub-section (11) of Section 143 of the Act, based on the comments in the auditors' reports of the Holding company and subsidiary company, we give in the Annexure a statement on the matters specified in paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Order, to the extent applicable.
- 2. As required by Section 143(3) of the Act, we report, to the extent applicable, that:
- -(a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit of the aforesaid consolidated financial statements.
- (b) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law relating to preparation of the aforesaid consolidated financial statements have been kept so far as it appears from our examination of those books and the reports of the other auditors.
- (c) The Consolidated Balance Sheet, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss, and the Consolidated Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the relevant books of account maintained for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated financial statements.

Notes forming part of the consolidated financial statements

1. Basis of Consolidation and Significant Accounting Policies

1.1.1 Basis of Accounting and preparation of consolidated financial statements

The consolidated financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries (together the 'Group') have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the 2013 Act") / Companies Act, 1956 ("the 1956 Act"), as applicable. The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention.

1.1.2 Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements relate to S.P. Apparels Limited (the 'Company') its subsidiary companies. The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the following basis:

The financial statements of the subsidiary companies used in the consolidation are drawn upto the same reporting date as that of the Company i.e., 31 March, 2015. These have been consolidated based on latest available financial statements.

The financial statements of the Company and its subsidiary companies have been combined on a line-by-line basis by adding together like items of assets, liabilities, income and expenses, after eliminating intra-group balances, intra-group transactions and resulting unrealised profits or tosses, unless cost cannot be recovered.

The excess of cost to the Group of its investments in the subsidiary companies over its share of equity of the subsidiary companies, at the dates on which the investments in the subsidiary companies were made, is recognised as 'Goodwill' being an asset in the consolidated financial statements and is tested for impairment on annual basis. On the other hand, where the share of equity in the subsidiary companies as on the date of investment is in excess of cost of investments of the Group, it is recognised as 'Capital Reserve' and shown under the head 'Reserves & Surplus', in the consolidated financial statements. The 'Goodwill' / 'Capital Reserve' is determined separately for each subsidiary company and such amounts are not set off between different entities.

Minority Interest in the net assets of the consolidated subsidiaries consist of the amount of equity attributable to the minority shareholders at the date on which investments in the subsidiary companies were made and further movements in their share in the equity, subsequent to the dates of investments. Net profit / loss for the year of the subsidiaries attributable to minority interest is identified and adjusted against the profit after tax of the Group in order to arrive at the income attributable to shareholders of the Company.

Goodwill arising on consolidation is not amortised but tested for impairment.

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared using uniform accounting policies for like transactions and other events in similar circumstances and are presented to the extent possible in the same manner as the Company's separate financial statements.

1.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of the consolidated financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the Management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

1.3 Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Fixed Assets are stated as cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of assets comprises of purchase price and directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to working conditions for its intended use including borrowing cost and incidental expenditure during construction incurred up to the date of commissioning.

Capital work in progress includes building under construction, construction expenditure incurred thereon and interest on the funds deployed.

Depreciation on tangible fixed assets of the company and its India subsidiaries is provided under straight line method based on useful life prescribed in Schedule – II of the Companies Act, 2013 Depreciation on tangible fixed assets has been provided on the straight-line method as per the useful life prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013 except in respect of the following-categories of assets held by the Company, in whose case the life of the assets has been assessed as under based on technical advice, taking into account the nature of the asset, the estimated usage of the asset, the operating conditions of the asset, past history of replacement, anticipated technological changes, manufacturers warranties and maintenance support, etc.:

1.4 Investments

Long term investments are valued at cost, less provision for diminution, other than temporary,in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and market value.

1.5 Inventories

Raw Materials, Stores, consumables and packing materials are valued at cost. Work in Progress Is valued at cost and includes production overheads as estimated by Management. Finished goods are valued under absorption cost basis at lower of cost and net realisable value after providing for obsolescence and other losses wherever considered necessary. Fabric waste is valued at net realisable value.

1.6 Revenue Recognition and Other income

Revenue from sales are recognised net of returns, rebates and trade discounts, when risk and rewards of ownership of the goods are transferred to the customer, which generally coincides with dispatch of goods from factory.

Export incentives comprising mainly of duty drawback are recognised as revenue on accrual basis, wherever certainty of receipts and value thereof are known.



Revenue from job work undertaken is recognised on delivering the goods to the customer on completion of the work.

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive the income is established.

1.7 Foreign Currency Transactions and Translations

Transaction in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. Monetary foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated at the year end exchange rate. Resultant gains or losses are recognised in the consolidated statement of profit and loss.

The accounting standard AS 11(Revised 2003) on the "Effects of Changes in foreign exchange rates" which was amended with effect from April 1, 2004 provides guidance on accounting of Forward contracts. The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India has clarified that AS 11 (Revised) is not applicable to the forward contracts which are for hedging highly probable forecasted transactions.

The Group has entered in to forward contracts which are designated as hedge of highly probable forecasted transactions. The Gain/losses of forward contracts designated as highly probable forecasted transactions are recognised in the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which the forecasted transactions is expected to occur.

Non-integral foreign operations:

- Transactions of non-integral foreign operations are translated at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction or at rates that closely approximate the rate at the date of the transaction.
- ii) All assets and liabilities of non-integral foreign operations are translated at the year-end rates.
- ili) The exchange differences on translation of balances relating to non-integral foreign operations are accumulated in a "Foreign currency translation reserve" until disposal of the operation, in which case the accumulated balance in "Foreign currency translation reserve" is recognised as income / expense in the same period in which the gain or loss on disposal is recognised.

1.8 Employee benefits

Short term

Short term employee benefits are charges off at the undiscounted amount in the year in which the related service is rendered.

Long term

Post retirement benefits comprises of Provident Fund and Gratuity which are accounted as follows:

Provident Fund

This is a defined contribution plan, and contributions made to the fund are charged to Consolidated statement of Profit and loss. The entities in the Group has no further obligations for future provident fund benefits other than monthly contributions.

II. Gratuity - Funded

This is a defined benefit plan. The entities in the Group makes annual contribution to a gratuity fund administered by LIC. The liability is determined based on the actuarial valuation using projected unit credit method. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised in full in consolidated statement of profit and loss for the period which they occur. The retirement Benefit obligation recognised in the Consolidated Balance sheet represents the present value of the defined benefit obligation as adjusted for un-recognised past service cost.





III. Leave Encashment

-There is no scheme for encashment of un-availed leave on retirement. Leave encashment of employees are paid annually and provision is made on accrual basis.

1.9 Taxes on Income

Provision for tax includes provision for current income tax, deferred tax and wealth tax.

Deferred tax is recognised for all timing differences arising between taxable incomes and accounting income at tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax assets arising from timing differences and unabsorbed tosses are recognised only where there is a virtual certainty that deferred tax assets can be realised against future taxable profits. The Group offsets deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities, and advance income tax and provision for tax, if it has a legally enforceable right and these relate to taxes in income levies by the same governing taxation laws.

Current tax is determined on the basis of taxable income and tax credits computed for each of the entities in the Group in accordance with the applicable tax rates and the provisions of applicable tax laws of the respective jurisdictions where the entities are located.

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) paid in accordance to the tax laws, which gives rise to future economic benefits in the form of adjustment of future income tax liability, is considered as an asset if there is convincing evidence that the entity will pay normal tax during the specified period. Accordingly, MAT credit is recognised as an asset in the Consolidated Balance sheet when it is probable that the future economic benefit associated with it will flow to the entity and the asset can be measured reliably.

1.10 Intangible Assets

Intangible assets include software licenses, trademarks, patents and copyrights. Software licenses are amortized-over a period of five years. Trademarks, patents and copyrights would be amortized on a straight line basis over their expected useful lives.

1.11 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying asset are capitalized (net of TUF subsidy) till the month in which asset is ready for its intended use. Other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which these are incurred.

1.12 Government grants and subsidies

Grants and subsidies from the government are recognised when there is reasonable assurance that the grant/ subsidy will be received and all attaching conditions will be complied with. When the grant or subsidy relates to an expense item, it is recognised as income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which is intended to compensate. When the grant or subsidy relates to an asset, its value is deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the related asset.

1.13 Impairment

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any indication exists, the assets are recoverable amount is estimated. An Impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

1.14 Leases

Finance Leases, which effectively transfer to the Group substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership of the leased item, are capitalized at the lower of the fair value and present value of the minimum lease payments at the inception of the lease term and disclosed as leased assets.



Leases, where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risk and rewards of ownership of the leased term, are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognised as as expense item in the Consolidated statement of profit and toss on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.15 Earnings per share

The earnings considered in ascertaining the Group's EPS comprise the net profit attributable to equity shareholders after tax and includes the post tax effect of any extraordinary item. The number of shares used in computing the basic EPS is the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year. The number of shares used in computing diluted EPS comprises of weighted average shares considered for deriving basic EPS, and also the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

1.16 Provisions and contingencies

A provision is recognised when the Group has a present obligation as a result of the past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent assets and liabilities are not recognised, however contingent liabilities are disclosed in the notes.

1.17 Cash and cash equivalents (for purposes of Cash Flow Statement)

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

1.18 Cash flow statement

Cash flow statement has been prepared in accordance with the indirect method prescribed in Accounting Standard 3 -Cash flow Statement, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Group are segregated based on the available information.

1.19 Segment reporting

The Group identifies primary segments based on the dominant source, nature of risks and returns and the internal organisation and management structure. The operating segments are the segments for which separate financial information is available and for which operating profit / toss amounts are evaluated regularly by the executive Management in deciding how to allocate resources and in assessing performance.

The accounting policies adopted for segment reporting are in line with the accounting policies of the Group. Segment revenue, segment expenses, segment assets and segment liabilities have been identified to segments on the basis of their relationship to the operating activities of the segment.

Inter-segment revenue is accounted on the basis of transactions which are primarily determined based on market / fair value factors.

Revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities which relate to the Group as a whole and are not allocable to segments on reasonable basis have been included under 'unallocated revenue / expenses / assets / liabilities'.
